Frequently Asked Questions

What is Title I?

Title I is a federally funded program designed to provide educational opportunities for your child to help every student reach and maintain grade level expectations. Title I programs are unique to each academic community.

Why is my child receiving Title I Services?

Every year students are assessed to determine their level of mastery of grade level curriculum. Any student who is below grade level expectations is recommended for Title I services. The Title I teacher will further evaluate each student to determine who has the greatest need for assistance. Students with the greatest needs are invited into the Title I Program. As students progress and reach appropriate grade level expectations, they graduate from the program.

How will this program help my child?

We use research based methods and instructional strategies to address the specific academic needs of your child. Title I provides extra help in your child's weakest academic areas. We use a variety of strategies designed to address all learning styles.

What will my child do during Title I Time?

Title I support can look different for each student depending on their needs. Often they will be working in small groups focusing on specific reading, math, science or social studies skills. Some students may work individually with a Title I teacher. They will also have an opportunity to work on research-based computer programs.

How can we communicate?
